Minimum 2.0 GPA No grade of D may be applied to the degree (includes grades of D+ and D-) Degree must be completed within 5 years All students admitted on Academic Caution are required to enroll in and pass ENG1100 in their first academic term

Submission of Graduation Application must be completed within the last academic term of a student's anticipated graduation date

Any course substitutions must be approved by the Academic Dean and the Registrar.
