Complete 30 credit hours of general education requirements A maximum of 50% of the program hours may be transferred if approved and allowable, including credit from an earned degree from Missional University on the same academic level

Minimum 2.0 GPA No grade of D may be applied to the degree (includes grades of D+ and D-)

Degree must be completed within 5 years All students admitted on Academic Caution are required to enroll in and pass ENG3100 in their first academic term

Submission of Graduate Application must be completed within the last academic term of a student's anticipated graduation date
